Kudinsky, Arnold Peisakhovich

Arnold Peisakhovich (Petrovich) Kudinsky (January 5, 1931 - July 7, 1996) - Soviet mathematician and choirmaster, founder and permanent leader of the St. Petersburg amateur chamber choir "Blagovest". Under the leadership of Kudinsky, the choir, one of the first in the Soviet Union, began to perform Russian sacred music ^[1].

Biography

Was born in Leningrad ^[2]. His father Peysakh Leibovich Kudinsky (1899-1941), a private, died at the front on September 26, 1941 near Petrozavodsk ^[3]^[4]. Mother - T.A. Perchil.

Graduated from school with a gold medal. Received a diploma of graduation from Leningrad State University with honors in 1952 ^[5] ^[6]. He was a student of GM Fikhtengolts and ES Wentzel ^[7].

After graduation, he was sent to Pechora, Komi ASSR, where he worked as a school teacher until 1955, in the same school with Yuri Azarov ^[5] ^[8].

In 1955 he entered the postgraduate course at LISS ^[5]. In parallel, he studied first at a music school, then at the Leningrad Conservatory ^[5].

After graduating from graduate school - senior lecturer, and then associate professor of the Leningrad Shipbuilding Institute ^[9] ^[10]. Published the textbook "Mathematical Analysis for Shipbuilders" (1990).

Graduated with honors from the conductor and choir department of the Leningrad Conservatory ^[5]. Organized in 1971 and for 25 years directed the amateur chamber choir "Blagovest" ^[11]. Under the direction of A. P. Kudinsky, the choir performed Bach's chorales, works by D. S. Bortnyansky, M. S. Berezovsky, A. A. Arkhangelsky, V. N. Zinoviev.

In 1981, the choir sang PI Tchaikovsky's "Chants of the Divine Liturgy", this was the first concert performance of the Tchaikovsky Liturgy in the Soviet Union ^[1].

In 1994, A. P. Kudinsky discovered and revived the work of Vasily Alexandrovich Fateev (1868-1942), composer and last choir director of the Kazan Cathedral ^[12] ^[13] .

Author of numerous articles on musical education and choral singing.

He died suddenly in July 1996 from a heart attack ^[12] ^[14] .
